Article 19: The Right to be Safe

This month, our school will explore Article 19 of the UNCRC, which states that every child has the right to be safe and protected from harm. This includes staying safe at home, in school, in the community and—especially relevant this month—online.

Throughout Safer Internet Week, pupils will learn about making responsible choices online, recognising unsafe situations and knowing who they can talk to if something worries them. We will be discussing how kindness, respect and awareness help keep everyone safe in the digital world.

In school, we will encourage children to think about how they use technology, what good digital choices look like and how they can take responsibility for themselves and others online.

This month, why not chat with your child about how they stay safe on the internet? Talking openly about apps, games and online behaviour is a great way to build their confidence, strengthen their awareness and help them develop positive online habits for life.

Shared Education P4






A special well done to Helena, Thomas and Katie who won medals - a fantastic achievement.
